The Martin Luther King Award, as given by the Northern California-Nevada Region of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), is an honor for which one cannot apply, only be recommended.

It is presented to a Disciple within the Region whose commitment to peace, racial reconciliation and social justice, like Dr. King,

- follows the example of Jesus, leads others in challenging those forces that allow injustice, bigotry to breed and grow
- opens new possibilities for understanding across the barriers that society builds, and/or
- connects theology—our understanding of God—with what is happening in the world around us.

It is generally given to one

- whose behavior is an example for others,
- who helps the region grow in its commitment to reconciliation, and
- who is known by some as a mentor.

The recipient is selected by the Reconciliation Committee at their fall meeting, and is presented by the Regional Minister and Reconciliation Committee chair on behalf of the region, at the region's Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration held in January.

We also ask you to limit your nomination to the amount of space provided (plus the additional testimonies you might provide), or to no more than 5 pages typed.
