- () Completed Application for Ministerial Standing (Appendix. 3 – Order of Ministry Policies)
- () Meeting with Regional Minister or designee
- () Reference Letters (3) as described in above Application
- () A copy of a graduate transcript showing completion of a course in “Disciples History and Polity” or completion of a reading program as directed by the Regional Minister
- () A copy of your ordination certificate and letter of good standing from current regional or denominational executive
- () A complete graduate transcript leading to an M.Div degree or its equivalent
- () A completed, signed, Background Disclosure Form (if not already on file with the Regional Office of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)
- () Completion of a Search and Call Profile of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) You have the option of personally completing the downloaded forms for use in this Region only or sending them to the Division of Homeland Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) for entrance into the nationwide data base.
- () Completion of Clergy Ethical Boundary Training within one year.

Following a favorable review of this document packet by the Regional Minister or designee, the applicant will be “Eligible for Ordained Ministerial Partnership Standing.” Once a call is secured, the Recognition and Standing Committee who may request to meet with the minister and may grant the eligible minister standing.
